Concept Note

Tribal Research and Cultural Institute (TRI), Government of Tripura & Department of Rural Studies, Tripura University in collaboration with the **Centre for North East Studies and Policy Research, JMI**, is organizing a 2-Days National Seminar on **“Problems of Educated Tribal Youths for Securing Job: Special References to the Tribal Youths of Tripura”** on February 27-28, 2020. The seminar will be hosted at Tripura University, Suryamaninagar.

About the Tribal Research and Cultural Institute

Tribal Research and Cultural Institute (TRI) was established under Tribal Welfare Department in the year 1970 as per decision of Government of India for launching studies on the socio-economic aspect of the different tribes of Tripura besides evaluation of all development schemes taken up for the benefits of the tribes. This institute deals in fundamental and applied research works on the socio-economic field, evaluation, documentation of tribal art and culture, preservation of tribal heritage, publication of research studies. The Institute collects manuscripts on tribal history and tradition, development of languages of different tribes etc. In addition, this Institute is also engaged for organizing seminar, workshop on different aspects of tribal development of issues along with training programme for the field level officers. It produces different documentary films on socio-economic & traditional aspects of Tripura tribes. This institute also organizes fairs and festivals of different tribes of the state to unfold the rich and diverse cultural heritage of the indigenous people of the state and to promote brotherhood and cultural interaction.

About Tripura University

the objective of Tripura University shall not only be “to disseminate and advance knowledge by providing instructional and research facilities” in the state in areas of contemporary relevance to the society and the country (with the motto “pursuit of excellence”) but to make special provisions for studies in tribal life and culture and to introduce vocational subjects with a view to provide employment opportunities to the students. The Act specifically enjoins the University to organize specialized diploma, degree and post-graduate courses in certain subjects. Keeping that spirit of the Act in consideration, Tripura University started its journey in 1987. On 2nd July, 2007 the University converted as Central University by an Act of the Parliament.

About the Department of Rural Studies

Since independence, India has faced many problems and challenges in the process of attaining sustainable socio-economic development. It is a fact that India could tackle some of the major problems, especially of achieving self sufficiency in food production. Indian economy, as we know it today, presents a paradoxical picture of extremes. There is persistent poverty, hunger, malnutrition, high rates of illiteracy, growing unemployment, etc. People living in rural areas are economically backward and are deprived of basic facilities like health, education, transportation, communication and amenities like safe drinking water, food, clothing, shelter, etc. As a result most of them are prone to poverty, illiteracy ignorance and ill health. To address the problems of rural area a professional approach is very important as against the traditional bureaucratic approach. Professionalism must become an integral part of rural development. In this direction the Department of Rural Studies, Tripura University preparing professionals with the line of *GLOCAL* (think globally and to act locally) to address the socio-economic problems of rural India.

About the Centre for North East Studies and Policy Research, JMI

The Centre for North East Studies and Policy Research is the first such research centre on the North East to be set up in a Central University. It was formally cleared by the Academic Council as an independent research centre in 2012. Its larger vision is to play the role of a leading research and resource centre on North East India for the academic community, professionals and policy-makers on key issues before the region and its neighborhood as well as to create a bridge between field and policy, between the North East and the rest of India. The Centre is committed to the key issues of gender and discrimination; peace and conflict; human rights; ethnicity and

identity politics; migration and transnationalism; governance; development and livelihood issues; water, environment and climate change; the North East and its peripheral areas and India's Look East Policy. The Centre seeks to achieve its objectives through teaching, research, workshops, seminars, collaborations and cultural events as well as publications and extensive dissemination.

About the Seminar

They are often projected as militant, rebellions, irrational and indisciplined. If youth power/energy is channelized constructively, there will be delightful future, not only for them but also for the society as a whole. Therefore, they should be properly guided and gently led. Unemployment is one of the deepest concerns in different countries including India. It is a key source of hardship, deprivation and suffering to the youth. As employment determines one's chances for leading a meaningful life, our actions, feelings and thoughts are considerably influenced by it. An individual's status in the family and neighborhood is the reflection of employment he/she holds. On the other hand, unemployment is a state of being without gainful work. It is considered as an involuntary failure to get income yielding work. It is a condition in which an individual is not in a state of remunerative occupation despite his/her desires to do so. It is a deprivation of the opportunity to an individual to fulfill their social obligations for which their education and other endowments have qualified him/her. The seminar will serve as a platform for discussion and debate among scholars, academicians and practitioners. Extended abstracts of 500-700 words are invited in the following areas.

- Soft skill challenges of tribal youths in job market
- Challenges of cultural transmission for the tribal youths in the job market
- Career Self-Efficacy Theory and the educated tribal youths
- Computer software self-efficacy and the educated tribal youths
- Any other relevant issue
