






National Seminar on Rethinking Gender : Issues of Work, Culture & Displacement

21-22 March, 2023



Call for Papers

Concept Note

Looking at 'work' from the perspective of gender today would require inclusion of the unpaid and often invisible work that women perform, in its domain. Beginning with the demand for equal pay at work, and advocacy for recognition of both productive and reproductive work of women, the SNA and extended SNA activities, valuation of women's work today in the emerging care market context has become a major concern. A redefinition of work would recognize women's productive labor and enable women to profitably engage in home-based work. Rights at work would include protection from sexual harassment at the work place and decent working conditions.

Culture plays an important role in work negotiations, conditions of human existence and construction of gender identities. With regard to poverty reduction, child marriage, menstrual health, care work, maternal mortality, property rights, violence against women and sexual minorities, etc. culture plays as a dominating factor to understand and address these issues holistically. Hence there is a broad consensus that the MDGs cannot be achieved unless they are culturally attuned. Culture has always traditionally attempted to strait practices and norms, and patriarchy has only tightened the grip of normative thinking. However, with the advent of critical theory, the same legitimizing normative practices have been put to question.

Moreover, for a large number of people, displacement from their places of residence, due to the effects of disasters and climate change and meta narratives of development projects, conflict becomes inevitable, affecting lives and livelihoods in general, and in terms of gender in particular.

This seminar aims at building a platform in which emerging notions of gender, culture and work may be discussed threadbare, transcending stereotypes that have restricted fluidity and openness.

Papers are invited on the seminar theme in the light of the above.

GUIDELINES FOR SUBMISSION:

- 1. The paper should be original and unpublished.
- 2. Abstract should be within 300 words with at least 4 key words and the length of the full paper should not exceed 3000 words.
- All submissions should be typed in MS Word in Times New Roman, font size 12 with 1.5 line spacing and API Style of Citation
- 4. Selected Papers presented in the Seminar will be published in an edited volume.
