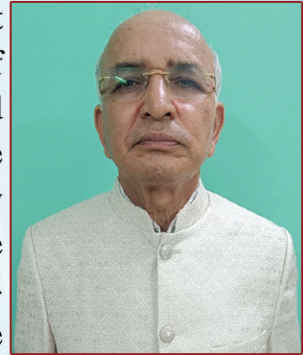

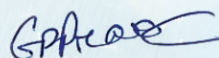
Diversity has been one of the major strengths of this university in the Northeast region. We are proud to declare that since the initiation of the CUET UG and PG level entrance tests, our university has opened the doors to hordes of students from our neighbouring states, and even from far-flung distant locations of North, South and East India. Students from the bordering nation of Bangladesh have also been of late begun to repose faith in the quality of education in our university. Students from Bangladesh have been regularly expressing their willingness to pursue undergraduate, postgraduate and even Ph.D degrees from Tripura University over the last few years. Through our infrastructural support we are successfully providing them residence and ensuring that we cater to diverse needs of our students hailing from diverse cultural backgrounds across India. Tripura University has shattered the myth of her long-standing status of being land-locked. We are now on the way to becoming mainstream, and are gradually gearing up towards becoming a leading player in higher education in India's Northeast.

The University is focused on the major pillars of academics, viz. teaching, training and research activities. The University provides the students with adequate infrastructural facilities

to support their teaching learning process, particularly in the area of laboratory training. In order to provide a conducive environment for overall academic development, the University campus has been made fully Wi-Fi enabled with 5 hostels (3 for women and 2 for men), quarters for faculty members, officers and staff, sports facilities, medical facilities (Health Centre with two full time male and female doctors, paramedical staff and Ambulance Service), 24 X 7 automated library facilities, a fully furnished Guest House that can accommodate more than 100 guests at a time, technology enabled Sugamya Pustakalaya facility for differently abled users, one dedicated Engineering Cell to cater to the needs of all stakeholders. Our University has also established a Psychological Testing Lab to take care of the mental health and well-being of all members of the University family. Such efforts have significantly boosted the performance matrix of the University in various assessment indicators. Our Faculty Members and supporting staff have been relentlessly working for the holistic development of the university.

I am delighted that the quality and reputation of our research has continued to grow. The grants received for R & D projects during 2023-24, as have been documented in the attached pages, bear testimony to the interest and dedication that our faculty members display towards the actualisation of research initiatives in this University. We have organised several seminars and conferences in the last one year to make our students aware of the recent trends in research activities.

Tripura University, to live up to the true spirit of NEP 2020, has dedicated itself to a committed emphasis on the Indian Knowledge Systems. 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About Tripura University

Tripura University was established as a State University on 2nd October 1987 and was converted into a Central University on 2nd July 2007 by an Act of Parliament to establish a teaching and affiliating university in the state of Tripura. The kings of Tripura, since 1947, guided by a zeal for education and inspired by a vision to excel, established many colleges in this green hilly state -- all affiliated to the University of Calcutta. But the geographic distance from the University of Calcutta being a formidable deterrent, it was virtually impossible on the part of a large number of poor students of Tripura to continue further studies after graduation since postgraduate education within Tripura was not yet initiated. The political history of Tripura since the 1960s, replete with students' movements, had consistently harped on the demand for expansion of opportunities for higher education and the establishment of a separate University in the state of Tripura. Initially, the Calcutta University authority agreed to offer post graduate classes in History, Mathematics, and Economics at the MBB College campus and the University Grants Commission (UGC) formally recognized the Calcutta University Post Graduate Centre (CUPGC) in 1976. But the dream for a full-fledged University within the state was yet to be fulfilled and students' demands gradually gathered momentum for a separate university for the cause of higher education in Tripura. For a decade, the CUPGC with all its limitations functioned as the highest centre of learning in the state, operating from various scattered old government buildings at College Tilla, Agartala. In spite of severe financial constraints, land for a new campus was selected by the state government for the CUPGC in a green 75-acre, semi-urban setting along the National Highway at Suryamaninagar, about 9 kms south of the capital city Agartala. With the aim of setting up a full-fledged University at that location in the near future, the foundation-stone was laid at Suryamaninagar campus on 18th December 1985 by Dasaratha Deb, leader of the historic Janasiksha (People's Education) movement and the-then Deputy Chief Minister and Education Minister of Tripura. Taking into consideration the long-cherished demands of the Student Community and the growing aspirations of the people at large and also acknowledging the present and future needs of education in the state, the State Government took the initiative to pass the Tripura University Act in the Assembly in 1987 and finally the first University in the state came into being. This was indeed a dream come true.

After its upgradation to a Central University in 2007, the overall development of Tripura University has been conspicuous by the all round efforts undertaken to strengthen the infrastructural facilities and academic acumen. The University is dedicated to the cause of developing and empowering the people of this state and the region by imparting quality education and technological innovations in the field of academic and research activities. The picturesque beauty in the idyllic surrounding of the campus provides the right academic ambience for nurturing young and potential minds.

As a conventional University, Tripura University has taken upon itself the responsibility to preserve and promote the enviable heritage of the state's indigenous art forms, folk, oral and multi-dimensional cultural traditions. At present there are five faculties, forty-five Departments and four Centres of Study in the University.



The future plans of the University include expansion of the campus and immediate installation of ICT-enabled classrooms in all the Departments, more hostels for men and women including research scholars hostels, improved canteen, guest houses and accommodation for the faculty and non-teaching staff, employment of modern technological tools and facilitating multimedia mode of interactive teaching-learning. In order to adapt with the demands of the changing times, the University has largely changed over to e-governance for efficient, accurate and eco-friendly administration.

Tripura University is accredited by NAAC in Grade B⁺⁺ with CGPA of 2.82 on a four-point scale. The University has also obtained recognition from AICTE, NCTE and similar other apex bodies for offering academic courses.

The number of affiliated colleges to the university has increased from 55 to 62 during this academic year.

Location, Climate and Connectivity

Located in the green picturesque state of Tripura, whose undulating topography comprises of low-lying hills shrouded with dense vegetation cover and interspersed with meandering rivers, rivulets and streams, the sprawling green campus of the university is an eye-catcher. Situated in West Tripura District about 9 km away from the City of Agartala and 24 km from Agartala Airport (Singerbill Airport), Tripura University is easily accessible by road.

The state is well-connected with Guwahati, Silchar and Shillong by road. A daily bus service from Kolkata to Agartala through Bangladesh has also taken off, for which a transit visa is needed. Agartala is also directly connected to Guwahati, Kolkata and other Northeastern cities and with other metros via Guwahati or Kolkata by air route. The earlier meter gauge railway line connecting Agartala to Lumding and Guwahati has been upgraded to broad gauge. Of late, the Rajdhani Express has also been introduced connecting Tripura to New Delhi and the rest of India. The average temperature of Agartala in summer is about 30°C and in winter, about 15°C.

Implementation of NEP 2020

We have wholeheartedly adopted the proposals of the NEP 2020, and have already begun its full-fledged implementation process step by step, through careful monitoring of changes in the curriculum along with the addition of Ability Enhancement and Skill Courses. Living up to the spirit of the NEP 2020, the university in all its programs at the UG level has adopted suitable courses on the theme of Indian Knowledge Systems. At present we are working on the implementation of the NEP 2020 at the PG level. Tripura University is planning to propose the opening of new departments of Social Work, National Security Study and Yoga along with a Center of Tribal Study and Research in near future. Considering the employment opportunities and demand of people of this region.



Facilities and Services

University Library :

The Central Library is committed to providing evidence-based innovative services, resources, and facilities for teaching, learning, research and innovation. The Central Library acts as a 'Knowledge Hub' in collecting, organizing and disseminating the widest possible access to information for its users. The Library constantly reviews its services and resources based on the feedback of the users by adding value-added services and resources. The Central Library gives more emphasis on supporting the teaching and research activities in the university.

The Central Library has a wide range of collections such as 166411 print books, 84 print journals, 21 magazines, 32431 e-books, 742 thesis, 1064 bound volumes, 15 newspapers, 1450 CDs/DVDs, 174 rare manuscripts etc. in it.

The Central Library relentlessly provides uninterrupted online user support to the entire users' community both in and out of the University through the 'Remote Acces' platform. The users can access more than 32431 e-books, 14 online databases through e-ShodhSindhu, subscribed by Tripura University, covering financial statistics, Government reports, Company profiles, abstracts and the metadata of more than one lakh e-books. The Central Library makes continuous efforts to ensure that the users are using Library resources efficiently and effectively. To sensitize in maximizing the use of various e-resources, the Library conducted several orientation programmes both offline and online which resulted in a tremendous surge in the usage of resources by users.

As a part of the research initiatives, the Central Library has developed 'Institutional Repository (IR)' using open source software for archiving the scholarly outputs of the University in digital mode. Further, the Central Library has successfully implemented IRINS (Indian Research Information Network System) and Vidwan Expert Database. The Central Library has access to the anti-plagiarism checking platform i-Thenticate and the academic research writing tool Grammarly.

The Central Library is always committed to providing the best resources and services to its users. It offers evidence-based innovative services such as online circulation, online membership, unique collections, anti-plagiarism service, document delivery service, research and citation support, reference service, digitization services, e-Library Lab, reprographic service, newspaper clipping service, new arrival alert, ask-a-Librarian, Department Library, etc. to its users. Research integrity is one of the key components of research. The Central Library strictly follows research ethics and sensitizes users about the importance of copyright, fair use, and anti-plagiarism policies.

Computing Facilities :

Tripura University takes proper measures to provide all possible computing facilities to the students, scholars and faculty. There are 5 general computer centres and 9 departmental computer centres with approximately 400 desktop computers. The computer centres are accessible to the students, research scholars and faculty during the University working hours for optimal utilization. Lab classes of Computer Skill-I and II are conducted in the above computer



centres. For better access internet facility is available in all departments, centres, offices, hostels and staff quarters 24x7. Wi-Fi facility has also been made available for mobile phones and laptops in the central library, the Guest House and all the departments. To work at times of power-cut, high capacity central UPSes are installed in most of the departments and offices for providing back up during power failures.

Central Instrumentation Centre:

Tripura University has established a Central Instrumentation Centre to facilitate the researchers of this university as well as researchers from other universities and institutions of Northeast as well as other parts of India. While using this Centre, the researchers from outside Tripura University may avail accommodation in the Tripura University Guest House. In this academic year, 31 research papers have been published using the facilities installed at CIC.

Hostel Accommodation:

Fully computerized internet-enabled hostel facilities are provided to students from outside the state/country, remote parts of the region and economically backward classes. Currently, there are three hostels for women and two for men. Two more hostel buildings having separate rooms and attached bathrooms with 50 seats capacity are available for research scholars. Common Rooms with various recreational facilities and reading rooms equipped with reading materials and magazines, news papers, T.V., etc., are also available in both the hostels. The hostel mess, run by students serves food to the boarders according to a prefixed menu determined by the boarders themselves.

Health Services :

Tripura University has its own Health Centre with two full time doctors (Male and Female), two nurses, a medical laboratory attendant and a female attendant to serve students, teachers, employees, officers, guests and their family members. A separate building has been allotted for this purpose where some beds with saline and oxygen facilities are available. Furthermore, the University possesses an ambulance with basic facilities to transfer patients to nearby hospitals in case of emergency.

Bank and Post Offices :

The university caters adequately to the requirements of the students, scholars and faculty with in-campus SBI branch and Post office during university hours.

Games and Sports :

The Sports Board of Tripura University came into existence in 2007. Every year various games and sports are conducted by Tripura University Sports Board. Annual Sports Day is organized in which various outdoor sports like football, volleyball, kabaddi and cricket, etc. and indoor game competitions such as table tennis, Carrom and chess, etc. are held. Every year the Sports Board organizes Inter College Tournaments in various categories like football, cricket, volleyball, judo, table tennis and athletics among the different affiliated colleges under Tripura University and participates in East Zone/ All India Inter University competitions with university contingent.

Placement Cell :

The Tripura University Placement Cell was established on 27.10.2005. In intercepting and mobilizing employment opportunities for students, the Cell plays a vital role and is gradually becoming a key cell of the University. The competition for employment is increasing every day and the task of placement is becoming a challenging one. The Placement Cell ensures and takes care to provide the best arrangements and hospitality for the visiting company officials and facilitates campus recruitment drives. It is relevant to mention here that the alumni of Tripura University occupy top positions in business, industry, R&D and academics in India and abroad and serve as the brand ambassadors of their alma mater.



The Placement Cell performs the following activities round the year:

1. Organizing various development activities that help in personality grooming of the students and provides them platforms to express themselves and enhance their soft skills.
2. Arranging winter/summer training for students.
3. Offering coaching classes for entry into services (for TPSC, Banks, Railway and other competitive examinations) for SC/ST/PH/OBC (Non-Creamy Layer) and minority students in collaboration with Equal Opportunity Cell, TU.
4. Inviting various organizations for campus recruitment.
5. Organizing different job-oriented training programmes by reputed organizations.

NSS UNIT:

NSS assists society by generating awareness and extending service. NSS Volunteers are stimulated to make changes through extension that result in more efficient production and marketing, conservation of natural resources, improved livelihood security, health and more satisfying family and community life. Extension work has manifold ramifications. It is also extremely location specific and usually susceptible to outside criticism. Through NSS-mobilized extension activities, people to people contact is initiated between students within the campus and the society outside.

The overall objective of NSS is to offer an extension of the academic activity of students and orient the student youth to community service. The educated youth who are expected to take the reins of administration in future are found to be unaware of the problems of the village/slum community and in certain cases are indifferent towards their needs and problems. Therefore, it is necessary to imbibe the social conscience of the students and to provide them an opportunity to work with the people in the villages and slums.

Reservation Cell :

This Cell is responsible for ensuring effective implementation of the reservation policy in admission of the students and the recruitment of teaching and non-teaching staff at various levels, allotment of staff quarters, hostels, etc. The main objective of providing reservation for Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Other Backward Communities (Non-Creamy layer category) and Economically Weaker Section (EWS) in Government services and admission of students is to improve their social and educational status so that they can take their rightful place in the mainstream of the society.

Anti-Ragging Committee and Squad:

As per the UGC Regulations on curbing the menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009, Tripura University formed an Anti-Ragging Committee and an Anti-Ragging Squad under the Chairmanship of the Vice-Chancellor. This Committee functions actively throughout the year to eliminate all possibilities of occurrence of ragging in any form.

Tripura University has a zero-tolerance policy towards ragging. Ragging in all its forms is totally banned in the entire Tripura University complex including the departments, and all its premises (academic, residential, sports, canteen, etc.). The University authority takes strict action against those found guilty of ragging and/or of abetting ragging.

University at a Glance

In agreement with the objectives set out in NEP 2020 and the SDG goals enunciated by the United Nations, Tripura University (TU) is actively engaged in fostering the teaching-learning process, putting a great deal of emphasis on research activities, particularly applied research, pursuing training to promote entrepreneurship and skill enhancement activities, and at the same time, striving to perform outreach activities. All of these are being undertaken for overall academic and societal growth of the University and the surrounding community. Tripura University believes in growing as partner in excellence instead of island of excellence. Research is focused towards areas of Regional as well as National interest. The curriculum and student projects are planned in such a way that the next generation manpower is fully trained to work towards the socioeconomic development of the region. The state of art library facility is so geared that there is an ambience created for reading and learning with extended hours of access to the resources both offline as well as online (Wifi enabled campus). Different MoU signed with industries, institutions as well as affiliated collages aims towards handholding of the students and grooming them with adequate input from both industry and academia. These initiatives have let to enhancing the opportunities for commercialization of indigenous commodities of Tripura like the Jampui coffee which was displayed at the 34th Tripura Industries and Commerce Fair (Jan to Feb 2024). In an endeavour to encourage new areas of alternative livelihood promotion in the state, organic cultivation of commercially viable comodities are being explored through development of standard cultivation practices and the first lot of organically produced Ramie fiber was sold to in this academic year. The land in the University is used for sustainable cultivation of vegetable and fruits through organic farming. This is supplied to the hostels and also to the university fraternity as a subsidized rate. The biodegradable waste at the University is converted into vermicompost in campus for inhouse use as well as sale. This way the University ensures environmental sustenance with healthy food production.





Like all central Universities, TU enrolls students from different states of India and abroad. In order to provide a conducive environment for overall academic development, the University Campus has been made fully WiFi-enabled with 5 hostels (three for women and two for men); quarters for faculty members, officers and staff; sports facilities; medical facilities; 24x7 automated library facilities; technology enabled Sugamya Pustakalaya facility for differently abled users, one dedicated Engineering Cell to cater to the needs of all the stakeholders on a timely basis. In order to meet the growing needs, additional girls' hostel construction is taking place. Tripura University has its own Health Centre with two full-time doctors (Male and Female) and supporting staff in a standalone building with 24x7 ambulance facility to attend to the University fraternity and the surrounding locality. In-order to ensure mental wellbeing, university has established a Psychological Testing Laboratory to cater to the needs of its fraternity. In order to support and sustain its plethora of activities, Tripura University has a state of the art Guest House that can accommodate more than 100 guests at a time.

We care for our students. For their holistic development, in addition to the revision in academic curriculum, an open gymnasium has been constructed with drinking water filters installed near the library and the gymnasium. In order to provide a hygienic environment for the students at the University Sanitary Napkin Vending Machine and Incinerator has been installed in the Ladies wash Room.

In the academic year 2023-24, the students' strength was 3828, while the scholars' strength stood at 405. In connection with PhD, in this academic year, a total of 187 students had registered, 25 had submitted their thesis while 65 were the awarded. The university had the distinction of receiving a Centre of Excellence for IAS coaching. It runs coaching for different competitive exams. The university has been actively engaged in different community and outreach activities with involvement of the students. The university puts thrust on gender sensitization and gender equity. The university has been promoting IP, Innovation, and Entrepreneurship with the policies in place. This has resulted in its gaining national visibility through different prestigious awards and funding.

In line with the national initiative of making all equipments/facilities available for in-house as well as external users (on a payment basis), Tripura University has become a part of I-STEM programme ensuring the availability of the 10 expensive equipments in the Central Instrumentation Facility to users as per requirement at a nominal cost, in addition to those in the different departments. Tripura University is making efforts strenuously to emerge as a university with distinction. Its thrust areas include all the verticals befitting a modern university, viz. teaching-learning, research, training, networking and collaboration and outreach activities all with the avowed goal of knowledge creation and dissemination along with the objective of enhancing the knowledge and skill sets of the students so that the teachers, students and the employees can together create a strong academic ecosystem for the betterment of the nation. This has resulted in the University publishing 382 research articles with maximum impact factor 11.9 and a total impact factor 621.154; 78 book chapters and 23 books in the current academic year. It has also conducted 67 seminar/training programs/conferences/workshops. In the

current academic year, the University has 14 granted patents, and 13 filed patents. The University has a total of 47 ongoing projects. Our faculty member is among the top 2% of the Scientist worldwide as per Stanford University Report. This year for the first time a faculty member from Tripura University was elected as a fellow of a National Academy (National Academy of Science India, Allahabad). In order to promote skill up gradation and entrepreneurship within the state, TU has opened “Dattopant Thengadi Employment Generation Resource Centre” in January 2023. The Centre has conducted four programs (awareness, facilitation, tour program for witnessing Entrepreneurship and Innovation) in this duration with student and faculty participation.

Major achievements/ Vision of the Department : The Department of Chemistry was established as “Post Graduate Center” of Chemistry under the University of Calcutta in 1976 at Agartala to cater the need of the local students. In the beginning, the department offered Master’s Degree in Chemistry with only Analytical Chemistry as specialization. With the increase in number of faculty and improved infrastructure, specializations in the areas of Inorganic Chemistry, Organic Chemistry and Physical Chemistry were introduced. Vision of the Department : The Department of Human Physiology was established in 2007 and the department strives for excellence in biomedical research and education to advance human health and welfare. At present, there are over 18 members in the department, including 4 full-time teaching staff, 4 non teaching staff and 10 research fellows. The basic principle that provides the foundation for the study of human physiology is the maintenance of homeostasis through the operation of complex control systems encompassing all levels of the hierarchy of human structure and function (i.e., cells, tissues, organs, and organs systems). Therefore, the course in the curriculum emphasizes an integrated study of humans across this hierarchy of structure and function. Staff of the Department of Human Physiology plays a major role in teaching to postgraduate students. Along with teaching, the faculty in the Physiology Department conducts outstanding, cutting-edge research on fundamental functions of cells and tissues. There is also keen interest in the cellular and molecular basis of diseases and translation of basic science research to develop novel therapeutic approaches.

Major achievements : Currently, the department boasts of five full-time faculty members and several Ph.D. research scholars. In addition to their teaching responsibilities, the faculty members are engaged in groundbreaking research across various modern health science areas. Their interests include the cellular and molecular basis of diseases and the translation of basic science research into novel therapeutic approaches. In this academic year 11 students have cleared CSIR-NET, North-east SLET and GATE. A new specialization on Ergonomics and Sports Physiology and new elective paper on Stem Cell Physiology have been opened in the department. Besides, 2 (two) PhDs have been awarded. Last year, 3 students have got government job in Post Office, MTS and School Teacher. 4 (Four) Students namely Maria Debbarma, Swagatam Das, Priyadarshi Saha and Sagar Sutradhar have joined to pursue their PhD degree.

Major achievements : The Department of Material Science and Engineering is one of the new teaching and research departments of Tripura University (A Central University), started its journey in 2016, included in the XII Five Years Plan, sanctioned by UGC. This department offers four-semester 'M. Tech.' program in 'Material Science and Engineering' (intake capacity of 17 students) and Ph.D. Program in 'Material Science and Engineering'. 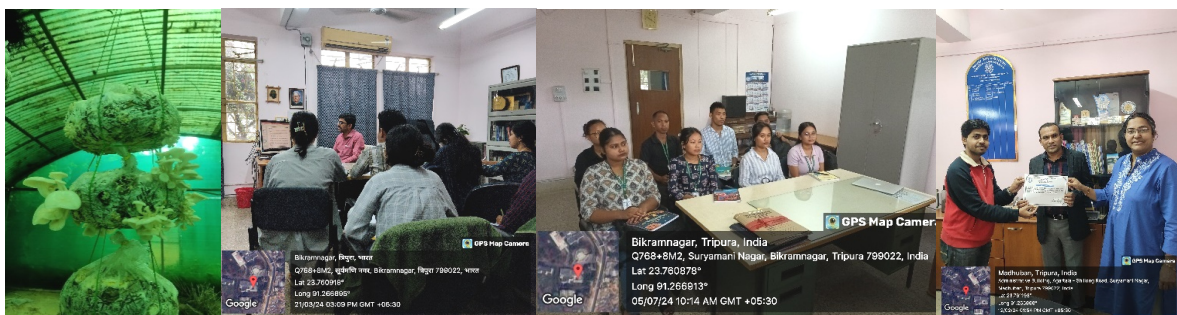

Vision of the Department : To emerge as the center of excellence in the North Eastern region of India to provide high-quality Education and Skill Based Training on Rubber Science and Technology.

Major achievements : The B. Voc Rubber Technology program has been launched by Tripura University in 2015. It is approved by UGC and equivalent to any three years Bachelor Degree Course. The course has been started in collaboration with National Skill Development Council (NSDC) and Rubber Skill Development Council (RSDC). It is designed to impart hands-on training to students starting from latex collection, preservation, rubber sheet preparation to the testing of latex, rubbers, and chemicals related to rubber industry. The course emphasizes on both theoretical and practical aspects of rubber technology. The primary objective of the course is to prepare skilled personnel by providing them with the desired level of competencies required to get an entry into rubber and related industries and encourage them to become entrepreneur. The course is very flexible, where students can opt out of the course after completion of one year of joining, with a certificate "Diploma in Rubber Technology". Those who opt out after completing two years will be awarded with an "Advanced Diploma in Rubber Technology" and after the completion of three years, the students would be awarded with "B. Voc in Rubber Technology". The course is meant for 10+2 students with science background. The complete course in B. Voc Rubber Technology is of six semesters. 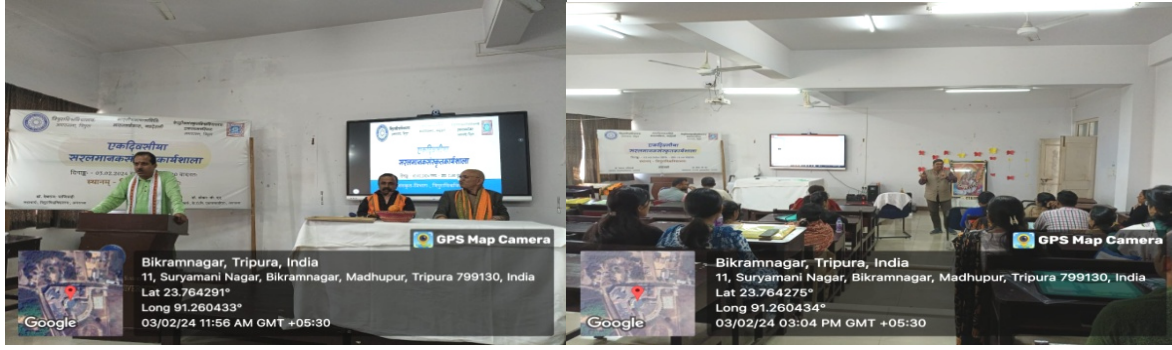

Vision of the Department :

The Department of History as part of the Faculty of Arts and Commerce strives toward to inculcate among its students a sense of rational, scientific and critical thinking skills and an understanding of the different facets of the history of World, India and North East India. It promotes a holistic understanding of the evolution of human societies from the earliest to the contemporary times through a scientific exploration of different sources, texts and meaningful interdisciplinary engagement. Its vision is to make the students and researchers conscious of the importance of the past in shaping our present and future. It strives to empower students to cope with the challenges of globalization by instilling in them a lifelong passion for learning about the past and thereby making them aware of the interconnectedness of past, present and future.

Major achievements: The Post-graduate classes in History first started in March 1976 in the P. G. Wing of MBB College, Agartala. The Calcutta University Post Graduate Study Centre (CUPG Centre) came into being in 1977, with a single student in the Department of History. In 1987 CUPG centre was converted into Tripura University. At first, the Department of History was known as the Department of Modern History under Calcutta University. Later on, with the establishment of Tripura University on 2nd October, 1987, the Department was renamed as the Department of History with its own syllabus. In 1997, the Department revised its syllabus with Part-I & Part-II system. In 2004, the syllabus was further revised as per UGC guidelines with unit system. And after conversion to Central University, a semester system was introduced in the Department from the academic session 2008. The Department endeavours to organize Seminars / Workshops / Popular lectures etc. The faculty members and research scholars of the department are engaged in various research activities. Students who are particularly interested in teaching and research are encouraged to prepare for UGC- NET exam as well as SET and to pursue Ph.D programme. Very recently, the UG syllabus of History has been revised keeping in mind the NEP, 2020. The department is planning to apply for the UGC SAP as part of the major research thrust in history to promote research in the department. At present the Department has 8 (eight) regular Faculty members (1-On lien) and 02 (two) non-teaching staff. The department has organized a two day international workshop titled "Gender, Culture and Capital across Northeast India" on 28th-29th November' 2023.

Major achievements:

The Women's Studies Centre of Tripura University, was recognized by the UGC in 2011 and receiving UGC funding from the Twelfth Plan period. Even before that, since its inception in 2006, as a cell, it is engaged in generating awareness about women's issues, in conducting research on these issues, in organizing extension activities, seminars and workshops. From 2011, under the UGC scheme of Development of Women's Studies in Indian Universities and Colleges the Women's Studies Centre, Tripura University started working on independent Research, Legal Advocacy, Documentation, Teaching, Training and Extension programme. Throughout its activities, the Centre has been trying to generate awareness about the role of women in society, by conducting various Seminars, Workshops and Interaction Programmes. The Centre has been instrumental in promoting visibility of women's issues and opened the avenues for a dialogue in multi-disciplinary collaboration in research and teaching even during the pandemic period. National Seminar on 'Public Policy for Gender Inclusion in Contemporary India: The Evolving Paradigm' on 21-22 March, 2024

Two Days National Seminar on 'Public Policy for Gender Inclusion in Contemporary India: The Evolving Paradigm' was organized by the Women's Studies Center, Tripura University during 21-22 March, 2024 with financial support from UGC. 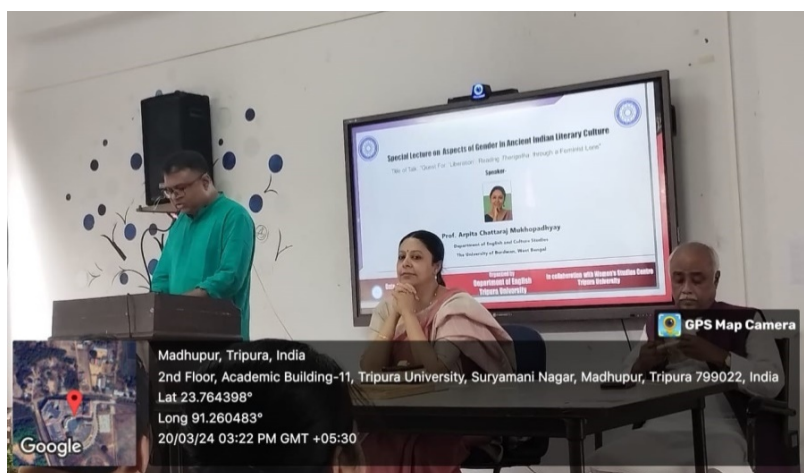

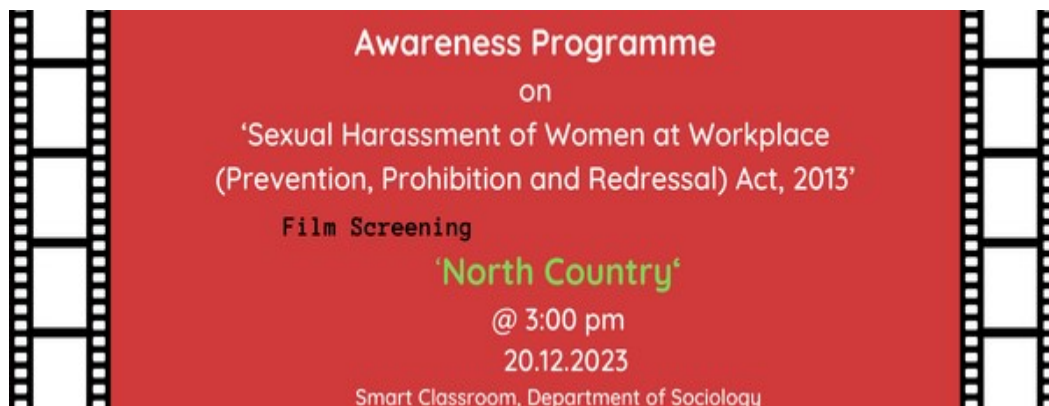

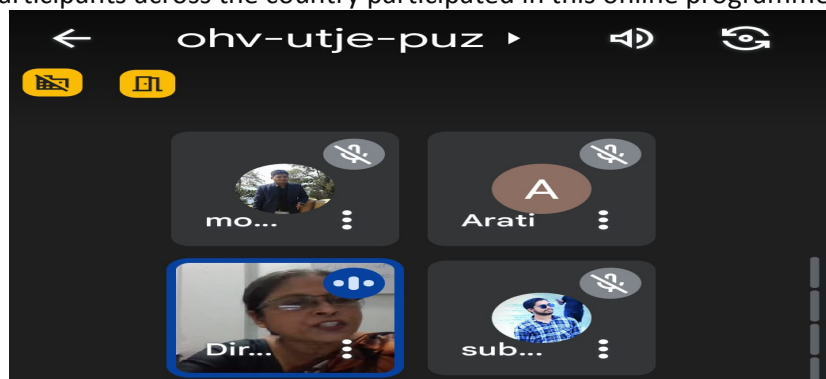

Vision of the Department : To emerge as the centre of excellence in North-East (NE) India in providing high quality Skill based Teaching and Training on Videography and Photography.

Major achievements : The B. Voc Film and Video Production programme was launched in the year 2015. It is a skill based course. This course is equivalent to a bachelor's degree. The course is approved by the UGC and National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC). Media and Entertainment Skill Council (MESCC) is the sector skill council for this programme. The course is designed to impart hands-on training to students in the field of film making and video production. The course structure emphasizes on both theoretical and practical aspects of film and video production. The primary goal of the course is to prepare skilled personnel by providing them with the desired level of competence required to get an entry to film industries. Moreover, students can opt for higher studies in film production and appreciation courses such as, film studies, once they complete their B.Voc degree. In addition, the course is very flexible in nature with multiple points of entry and exits. Students can opt out of this course after completion of one year of joining, with a Diploma in Film and Video Production. Those who opt out after completing two years will be awarded with an Advanced Diploma in Film and Video Production, and only after the completion of three years, the students will be awarded with B. Voc in Film and Video Production which is equivalent to a bachelor degree. Along with this, the students are also certified by the Media and Entertainment Skill Council for various Qualification Packs (QPs) with their associative job roles for getting employment in the media and entertainment sectors. This year, a good number of students have qualified for the QP-Script Researcher. The assessment test for Script Researcher was conducted by Media and Entertainment Skill Council (MESCC) and B.Voc film and Video Production in Tripura University campus on 21st June 2016. 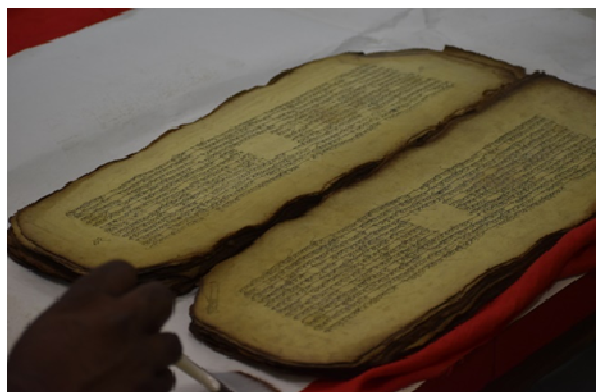


Manuscript Resource Centre (MCC)

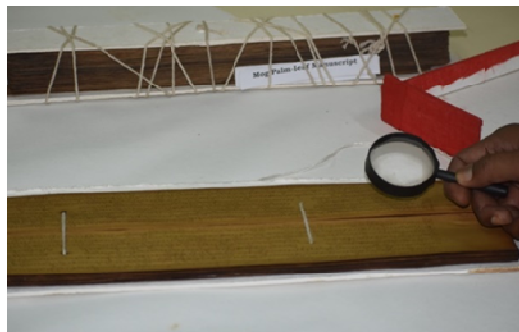

It is through the manuscripts that we can connect the past with the present knowledge society. Conservation and preservation of manuscripts with appropriate methods are essential steps to reveal the past through cultural information. Central Library of Tripura University has been instrumental in conserving and preserving the manuscripts of the North-East region.



The MCC came into being in the Department of History, Tripura University, on 20th December 2010 after signing an MOU with the National Mission for Manuscripts, Ministry of Culture, Government of India, New Delhi. The Centre was inaugurated on 12th April 2011.

The main objective of establishing this centre is to collect, conserve and preserve the manuscript of Tripura state incorporating modern and indigenous conservation methods. The collaboration also promises more intense coordination between the scientific community and manuscriptologists, to bring forth better technological tools and techniques to decipher, search, and retrieve the knowledge stored in these rare scriptures.



The Central Library has collected and preserved more than two hundred rare manuscripts from different parts of Tripura State. The Central Library has taken several initiatives to collect and preserve the rarest and most endangered manuscripts for the future generation. Collected manuscripts have been preserved through scientific methods and are properly catalogued. The Central library has conducted several workshops and seminars from time to time to



sensitize the importance of conserving and preserving ancient manuscripts among rural and urban people. The manuscript donors are sensitized to donate their manuscripts for the benefit of research, teaching, and learning. The centre is trying to sensitize the people of Tripura state about the necessity of preserving these age old manuscripts. By preserving these valuable manuscripts, it will help us to discover precious historical facts about Tripura.

Bioinformatics Centre

With the financial support of DBT, New Delhi, Bioinformatics Centre was established in 2008 at Tripura University under the supervision of Prof. S. Banik, Principal Investigator of the project & the then Head of, Department of Zoology. 11. Departmental Library

12. Digital Library System & e-Lab

The e-Library has access to more than 35 dedicated computers having LAN connectivity and Wi-Fi access.

13. Online User Attendance Management System

The Central Library has implemented its in/out Online Attendance Management System using open-source software for monitoring the entry/exit of Library users. The System was developed and maintained by the Central Library.

14. Library Automation, Digitization & Digital Repository

- The Central Library uses open-source Integrated Library Management Software-KOHA for its in-house operations. The Library manages the entire operation through ILMS- KOHA to facilitate circulation, cataloguing, acquisition, serial control, OPAC, and other automation activities. The Library uses open-source software Vufind and J-Gate for the federated search facility.
- The Central Library has a dedicated Library portal to showcase the services and facilities for the users. Users can access rules and regulations, opening hours, services, resources, OPAC, Remote Access, etc.
- The Central Library introduced a remote access facility for accessing online resources both on and off campus.
- The Central Library has established a state-of-the-art technology-enabled digitization section with adequate scanning and digitizing facilities. The Central Library has digitized and uploaded 488 Ph.D. theses produced by the University in ShodhGanga hosted by the INFLIBNET Centre and bibliographic records of books and journals with IndCat.
- The Central has implemented an Institutional Digital Repository (IDR) using Open Source Software-Dspace to upload scholarly content such as theses, journals, manuscripts, old questions papers, etc., produced by the academic fraternity.

15. Sugamaya Pustakalaya: Facilitation Centre for Visually Challenged

The Central Library is committed to providing services for 'Divyangjan.' With this aim, the Central Library has set up the 'Sugamya Pustakalaya' Facilitation Centre, which will help the visually challenged to use Assistive Technology for their teaching, learning, and research. The Central Library is a member of 'Sugamya Pustakalaya,' a collaborative initiative by Daisy Forum of India (DFI), the National Institute for Empowerment of Persons with Visual Disabilities (NIEPVD), and T.C.S. which has the facility for visually challenged (Divyangjan) to access more than 678483 braille books, talking/audio Books, eBooks available for download. Visually challenged can access and download for reading and listing. The Central Library has



basic physical facilities for 'Divyangjan' such as Ramp with railing on the Library premises, Wheelchairs, Washrooms, on-demand, staff assistance in borrowing Library materials, etc. The Central Library has assistive technologies & library resources for the visually challenged, such as KIBO XS, KIBO Desk Web application, Kibo Android App, Accessible Audio Books, Computer with Audio enabled device, Digital Scanner, etc.

18. Resource Sharing and Participation in Consortia

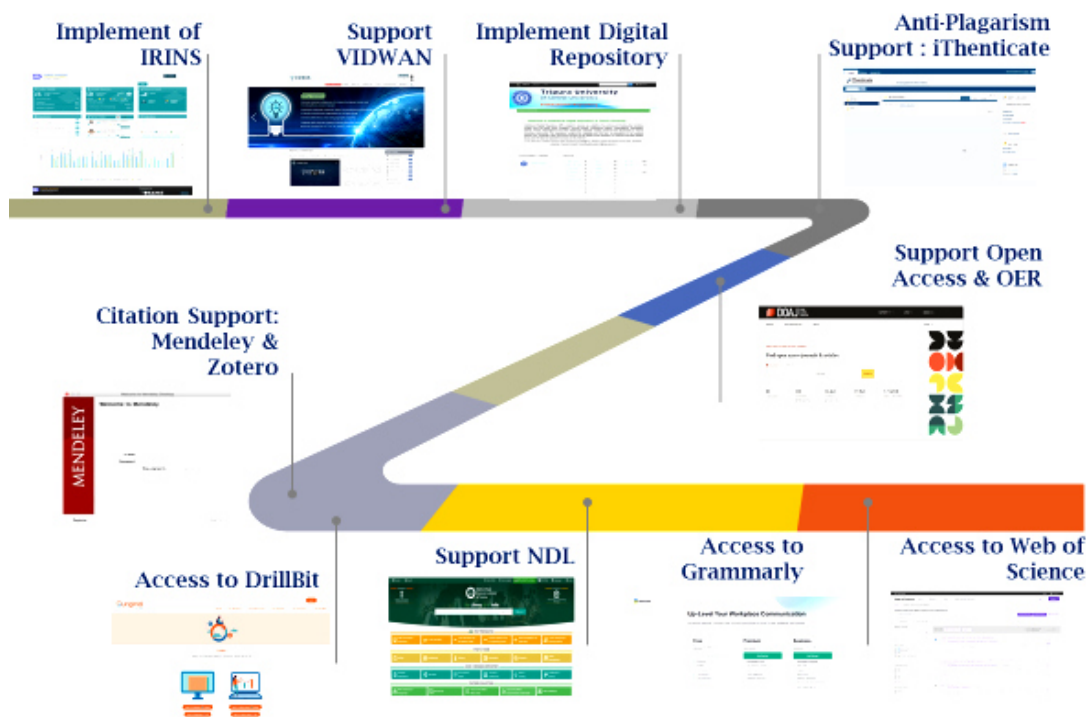

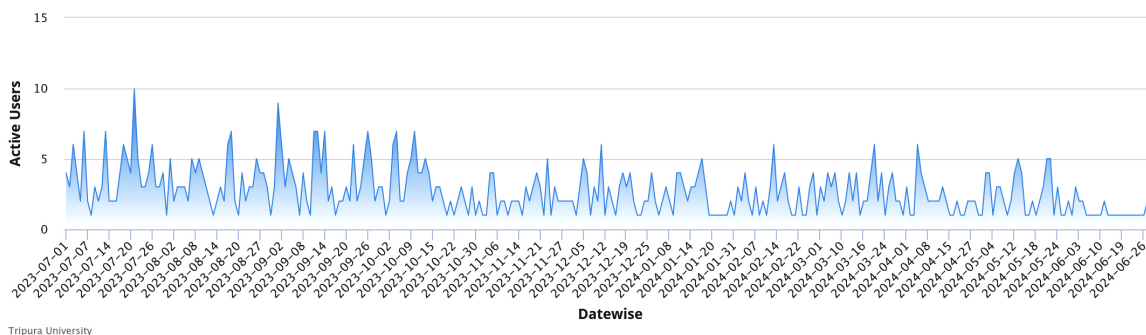

Cumulative Usage of Online Resources through Remote Access Service

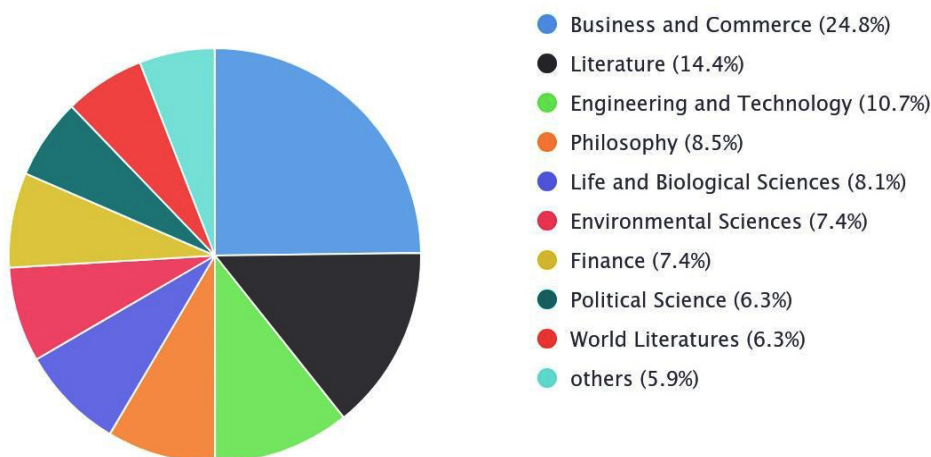

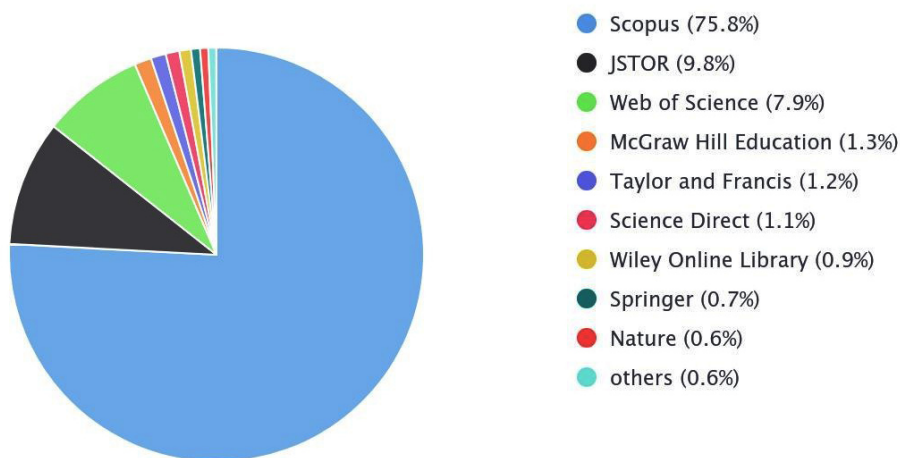

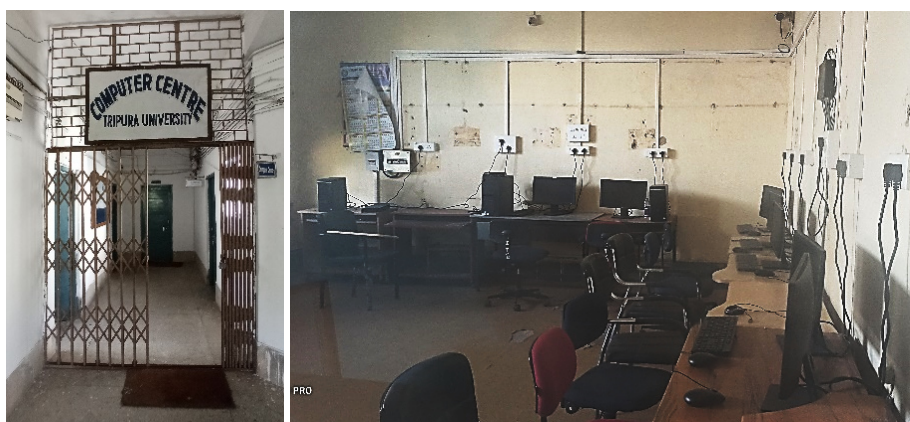




School Children visiting the Central Library under Library Extension Activity

Computer Centre

A Computer Centre was established in 1992 to support diverse computing requirements for its stakeholders of Tripura University. The Computer Centre has implemented LAN facility in campus with optical fibre backbone connecting the academic and administrative departments spread over the University campus. The Centre offers essential ICT services, including internet access, firewall, emailing, MIS, IT security, WiFi, maintain the university portal, troubleshooting, etc. Computer Centre supports various functional requirements of the University, such as students admission, ICT enabled classrooms, etc. The Computer Centre conducts counselling programme for faculty and students on online courses developed by MHRD using SWAYAM and NPTEL. The Centre implemented Google Workspace (formerly GSuite for education) for its stakeholders. The Centre extends help in conducting academic events like Conferences, Workshops, Training Programmes, Workshops, Lectures, etc.





Health Centre

The University has its own Health Centre to provide basic Out-Patient department (OPD) and observation facility for its stakeholders. The Tripura University Health Centre also attends to patients from adjoining areas providing them with medicine and urgent treatment in case of emergency. The Health Centre is equipped with oxygen (using oxygen concentrator), nebulizer, sterilizer, and other basic equipment that are essential for primary healthcare. The Tripura University Health Centre is open from morning until night to provide healthcare. Two medical officers and two nurses provide their regular services at the Health Centre, instilling confidence in the university family. The Health Centre has an ambulance facility.





TRIPURA UNIVERSITY SPORTS BOARD

The Tripura University Sports Board came into existence in 1998. The Faculty Development Centre (FDC) of Tripura University was established in the year 2016 under the Major Project “Pandit Madan Mohan Malaviya National Mission for Teachers and Teaching (PMMMNMTT)” launched by the Ministry of Education, Government of India. This was established initially as a 5 year project in order to make development of Education in the Country by giving training to faculties working in different Higher Education Institutes. 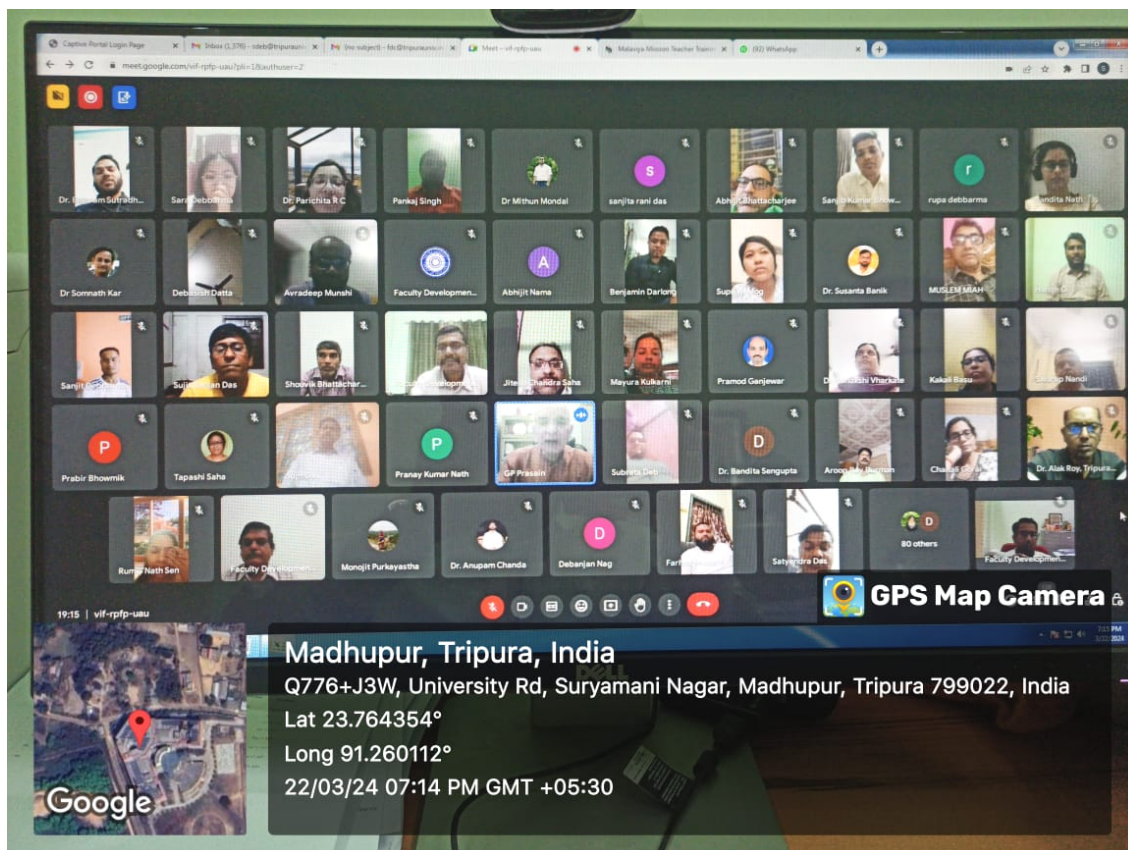
Eight Days Online NEP Orientation and Sensitization Program by MMTTC, Tripura University from 11th March to 22nd March, 2024.

Tripura University has established a Faculty Development Centre (FDC) under the Scheme of Pandit Madan Mohan Malaviya National Mission on Teachers and Teaching (PMMMNMTT) in December 2014. UGC has recognized 110 institutions of India as part of Malaviya Mission by renaming the existing FDCs. Likewise the name of our centre has been changed to Malaviya Mission Teacher Training Centre, Tripura University (MMTTC-TU). At present, the Centre is engaged in training faculties and officials of Higher Educational Institutions to build competencies in them for better teaching, learning and research, enhancing and updating their knowledge and skills in order to provide more effective teaching, administration and aligning them with the societal needs of NEP 2020 within the purview of Indian values and value system.

The Centre has conducted its first **Eight Days Online NEP Orientation and Sensitization Program** for faculties and officials of State and Central Universities/Academic Institutions from **11th March to 22nd March, 2024** through online mode. A total of 200 candidates applied through the portal and around 145 participants attended the program. The program was conducted in the evening for two weeks (Eight Days) with two sessions of 1 hour and 30 minutes each from 3.00 pm to 6.15 pm. The participants were Assistant Professors, Associate Professors, and Officers from different academic institutions of India. Sixteen Resource persons delivered their speech during the program and all of them were renowned Professors from premier academic institutions from different parts of the country who have registered themselves as a Resource Person in MMTTC portal. The topic covered during the program were Holistic and Multidisciplinary Education;



Indian Knowledge Systems; Academic Leadership, Governance and Management; Higher Education and Society; Research and Development; Skill Development; Student Diversity and Inclusive Education; Information and Communication Technology. There were interactive session after every technical session and participants were able to understand the detail of National Education Policy 2020 and its implementation through this orientation and sensitization program.
